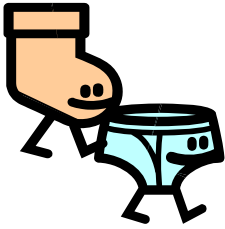

SOCKS AND UNDIES FOR THE NIGHT MINISTRY!

Thanks to everyone who contributed to the sock and underwear tree for the Night Ministry. We collected 145 pairs of Socks, 54 pairs of women's underwear, and 144 pairs of men's underwear for a grand total of 343 items! We have been in contact with the group and will deliver the items by the end of July. The Night Ministry are very appreciative of our efforts.

TIME AND TALENTS IN A BALE

(Originally printed in the October 1999 issue of Lutheran Women Today)

One April morning, six women piled quilts, many bags filled with health care kits, and a heavy bag of bar soap into the back of a minivan, then found seats in the van for themselves. This was the Lenten offering of material goods from the quilting group and our small congregation, Lutheran Church of the Congregation in Roseville, MN. We were taking it to the Lutheran World Relief warehouse in Minnesota.



During our tour of the LWR warehouse, the manager showed us how 40 quilts are strapped together into bales and wrapped in burlap. The burlap then is stamped with the necessary information. We walked among the piles of baled clothing, mounds of large, stapled, sealed and labeled cartons that contained kits of various kinds. Cartons of bar soap lined up against one wall.

The previous week, four 40 foot ocean-going containers filled with quilts, clothing, soap, and kits had been shipped off for distribution overseas. One such container can hold 280 bales of quilts, which adds up to 11,200 quilts to put on beds or become beds, provide disaster victims with refugees with warmth, or privacy when hung as room dividers - and to tell them someone cares. *(Article to be continued in next month's Messenger.)*

MESSIAH MOVIES



EVELYN (Available on DVD.)

Based on real-life events, *Evelyn* follows the story of Desmond Doyle (Pierce Brosnan), who is devastated when his wife abandons their family on the day after Christmas. His unemployment and the fact that there is no woman in the house to care for the children - Evelyn, Dermot and Maurice – make it clear to the authorities that his is an untenable situation. The Catholic Church and the Irish courts decide to put the Doyle children into Church-run orphanages, splitting up the boys and girl. Although a sympathetic judge assures Desmond that when his financial situation reverses, he will be able to get his children back, money is hard to come by. During that time, Evelyn and her brothers suffer the abuses of living in orphanages while Desmond struggles to secure finances. Now he must battle the Irish Supreme Court to get his children back.

I think the reason I liked this movie so much is that the father character, Desmond, is not a superman...he is everyman. This is a sweet, thought provoking movie based on true events. The way courts in the United Kingdom, and even here in the United States, deal with custody issues involving father's rights can be traced back to these actual events, and the decision by the Irish Supreme Court in this case. Beautifully acted by Brosnan, and by the young actors who play his children, this is a family movie that all will enjoy. If you rent the DVD, there are additional special features that include more information about the original case, and the inspiring sequence of events about how this story came to be made into a motion picture. I highly recommend *Evelyn* as a movie to lift your spirits.
